


WHAT DO YOUNG WOMEN THINK?

This endeavour is ambitious, in the context of a vast country like India. We need to build this knowledge step by step, focusing on different segments.


ASPIRATIONS OF GIRL STUDENTS OF DELHI



In a young country like India, it is imperative that the focus is on youth. And FLO did focus on youth. It crossed yet another milestone in its endeavour to acquire knowledge about the hopes and aspirations of young women by conducting research on the aspirations of girl students in NCR, Delhi, in association with Hanns Seidel Foundation, Germany.

Conducted in July 2004, in the colleges of NCR Delhi, the survey was focused at providing insights into the confidence level of girls in achieving their goals and the difficulties faced by them in the process.

WOMEN IN SERVICE INDUSTRY IN FIVE METROS



Looking at the rapid change and growth of the Indian economy in the past few years, FLO with the support of Hanns Seidel Foundation, Germany decided to conduct a study on conditions for women working in the fastest growing sector-the service industry in India. Recent figures show that of the three-agriculture, manufacturing and services, the last has shown the fastest growth rate of 6.8% in 2001-02 and 7.1% in 2002-03. In the coming years, it is estimated to grow even faster.

Having fine-tuned our attention to women in the service sector, we selected cities from the five zonal areas of North, South, East, West and Central India which are truly representative. The cities chosen were Delhi, Mumbai, Kolkata, Chennai and Hyderabad.

HSF AND FLO, GOING PLACES TOGETHER

The dynamic nature of today's business and society makes constant innovation and fresh thinking critical. Recognizing this, HSF and FLO got together and initiated new Training Programmes and Workshops that are relevant in this day and age. These ranged from a 20-days Business Management Programme, a 10-day programme on Basic Counselling Skills for Working Women, Workshop on Effective Communication, How to choose a Business, Workshop on Event Management-A Career Option and Packaging Entrepreneurship Workshop.

PBC is the first private company to be awarded Software Technology Incubator Park status by the Government of India, and is known for its innovative solutions in improving Indoor Air Quality. Addressing the FLO delegation, Mr. Kamal Meattle, Chief Executive Officer, PBC, gave some tips on how to increase the quality of indoor air with the help of plants.

"Trees like Teak and Peepul are best for environment as they give more oxygen than normal trees," he said. "Arica Palm is a good plant to be kept in the living room, as it gives more oxygen than normal plants during daytime. 'Mother-in-law's Tongue' is a plant good for bedrooms. It gives more oxygen at night." he added.

Delegation to Srinagar and Leh

TURKEY



The delegation met the representatives of "KAGIDER", a Turkish women's organization with the main objective of promoting and helping women entrepreneurs. ISRAEL

The delegation visited one of the important Kibbutzs of Israel. The Kibbutz is an uniquely Israell form of Communal living. The Tzora Kibbutz is situated in the heart of Tzora valley. In the beginning, Tzora's main income came from agriculture. But today, only 30% of their income comes from agriculture. Their population is 800 including children, young adults, students, and parents of members.

In addition, FLO met Mr. Raminder S. Jassal, Ambassador of India in Israel, in Tel Aviv. He apprised the delegation of the opportunities available for Bilateral trade with Israel.

UNITED KINGDOM



A Seminar on Arts was organized for the delegation in Edinburgh in the office of the Indian consulate. The focus was on the importance of the Edinburgh Arts Festival, which is now annually held in 263 venues with 25,000 performances taking place and millions of tickets sold. There were hosts of speakers from different fields. The seminar was followed by tea hosted by Mr. P.L. Randhawa, the Consulate General of India, Edinburgh.

FLO organized a visit to manufacturing unit of Sheela Foam Pvt. Ltd., at Greater Noida, (Manufacturers of Sleepwell Mattresses and Comfort Products) on December 7th, 2004. Sheela Foam Pvt Ltd. was established in 1971 by Ms. Sheela Gautam, a first generation entrepreneur with Quality and Integrity as its core values. Till 1989 its was growing at a slow pace due to Government policies. It started looking up in 1990 with liberalization and is at present the market leader in its category. Today, it has around 3000 dealers and 50 distributors all over India.

Around Fifty Five FLO members joined this excursion led by the FLO President Ms. Namita Gautam. Members were welcomed by Mr Rahul Gautam, Managing Director, and Mr. Praduman Patel, Joint Managing Director, and an introductory presentation was made. This was followed by a tour of the shopfloor, where members could see the process of foam manufacture, and its processing for different end uses. The members were also shown the Quality Control Laboratories. The visit to Plant was followed by an open air lunch hosted by Sheela Foam at Jaypee Golf Club, Greater Noida.



Their inherent ability to nurture, feel compassion and be guided by instinct should not be interpreted as weakness. Their role as mothers, places them in the critical position to change society. They have the power to reverse the retrogressive concepts about women introduced in society by men. After all they are the sacred feminine glorified in Islam by the will of Hazrat Hajra, symbolized in India by the concept of Ardenareshwariand extolled in Christianity by the purity of the Virgin Mary.

In September 2000 The United Nations Millennium Summit adopted eight major goals which were internationally agreed and accepted as framework for measuring development progress. These are:

- 1. Eradicate extreme poverty and hunger
- 2. Achieve universal primary education
- 3. Promote gender equality an empower women
- 4. Reduce child mortality
- 5. Improve maternal health
- 6. Combat HIV/AIDS and other diseases
- 7. Ensure environmental sustainability
- 8. Develop global partnership for development

None of the above mentioned MDG's have any chance of success without a robust participation from 50% of women that constitute the population of a world that urgently needs to correct the imbalance between its words and deeds that give women their rightful place to jointly achieve the point agenda on which hinges the future prosperity of the world.

What should be done?

- 1. Campaign for suitable legislation wherever necessary.
- Campaign amid social groups that discriminate against women. Use the court of law to compel social groups to abandon practices that humiliate and dishonour women.
- While the middle class women may be less willing to improve her condition, the poor women is most interested in getting herself out of the vicious circle of suffering and indignity. Focus on her plight.
- 4. Raise consciousness among social groups that discriminate because of poverty and not on the basis of custom as in the middle class.
- Focus on the filed rather than on society. Choose areas in the field where direct empowerment through financial intervention can bring about change.
- 6. Concentrate effort on the education of the women among the poor class.

I will conclude by evoking the simple message of Paolo Coelho in which he says that when there is purity in your heart, sincerity in your purpose and integrity in your actions, the whole world conspires to help you achieve your goal. This he calls the principle of favourability. I believe that if the collective souls of all the women in the world unite they can produce the positive energy that is needed to change this world torn with war and strife, raked with hunger and disease and sunk in poverty and despair into a veritable Utopia where men and women walk hand in hand towards the shared goal of lending mutual respect and dignity to each

The Hanns Seidel Foundation

The HANNS SEIDEL FOUNDATION (HSF) is named after the late Dr. Hanns Seidel (1901-1961). He was the Chief Minister of Bavaria (1957-1960) and Party Chairman (1955-1961) of the Christian Social Union (CSU).

The HSF was founded in 1966 in Munich and has the legal form of a registered society. It is one of the youngest amongst the five German Foundations in India.

The government has accorded it a high priority, with a number of fiscal incentives, to encourage commercialization and value addition to agricultural produce; for minimizing pre/post harvest wastage, generating employment and export growth.

FLO organised a workshop on Fruit Processing Entrepreneurship in New Delhi. Attended by the young and potential entrepreneurs seeking career in this field, the workshop was quite successful.





Workshop on Public Speaking



New Delhi: August 25-27, 2004: The act of public speaking could be defined as, a talk or address, especially one delivered to an audience. Yet, to many people the notion of speaking in public has the effect of rendering one speechless. Some studies show that many view public speaking as their number one fear. For the first time, FLO organised a workshop on Public Speaking which was divided in two batches. The workshop was conducted by Mr. Abhijit Bhaumik, an IIM, Ahmedabad alumini. This workshop aimed to make people confident in public speaking through presentations and direct interactions.

Workshop on Basic Counselling Skills

New Delhi: September 1-15, 2004: There are many occasions when counselling is necessary and there is not always availability of time, necessity or the resources to approach a professional. Counselling is often necessary during performance reviews and appraisals, or when harassment issues arise, when employees are suffering from work-related stress, which is affecting their performance and/or morale and most importantly at home. Timely intervention can prevent the loss of valuable relationships, save time and money and improve performance and morale.

For the first time, FLO organised a 10 days workshop on Basic Counselling Skills. This course was designed to develop counselling skills which will enhance the participants' effectiveness in a wide range of situations. These included interpersonal skills, which promote the development of relationships, such as observation skills, reflecting skills, perception, creating space and managing silence in various situations.

Millions in known and unknown corners of this gigantic country depend upon handicraft and handloom business for their livelihood, directly or indirectly.



To broaden the consciousness of the entrepreneurs, FLO organized a workshop on Handicrafts & Handlooms Entrepreneurship. This year packaging was added as a new topic in this programme. Mr O P Prahaladkar, Managing Director, K K Mfg. Co. Ltd shared his views as an established Business person.

The report of the survey 'Aspirations of Girls Students in Delhi', conducted by FLO with support of Hanns Seidel Foundation, Germany was released on 23rd December, 2004 by Dr. (Ms.) Sayeda Saiyidain Hameed, Member, Planning Commission of India.

After a short presentation on the report by project director Dr. Renu Chopra, Dr. Karl Fischer- Resident Representative HSF, in India, congratulated her for carrying out the study so efficiently. He touched upon the problems faced by Girl students globally and
