

AN INTERACTIVE SESSION ON KASHMIR - A FRIENDSHIP BOND BETWEEN INDIA & PAKISTAN OR A BONE OF CONTENTION?

New Delhi: May 11, 2005

Speaking at an interactive session on" Kashmir - a bond of friendship between India and Pakistan or a Bone of Contention" organized by FICCI Ladies Organisation, Mr. Omar Abdullah, M.P. said that the gentle facilitation of US in resolving the issue is welcome." US has its own compulsion to see an end to terrorism globally and this may help in bringing India and Pakistan together to find an end to the dispute on Kashmir and also ending a decade long terrorism in Kashmir. He also said that the afford world cannot confrontation between the two nuclear powers and this reality keeps the





momentum of witnessing a remarkable progress.

He refuted the idea that India and Pakistan can exist in future like the way the two Germany have united. The idea of uniting both India and Pakistan like the East and West Germany, or the possible union of North and South Korea, is not going to happen, possibly, he added.

Talking about the trade and economic prospects between India and Pakistan, Mr. Omar Abdullah said that the trade route should be developed further. The trade scenario has been bleak and it has to improve further.



FLO BUSINESS DELEGATION TO PAKISTAN

New Delhi: May 23-28, 2005

Close on the heels of the Pakistani President General Parvez Musharraf's friendly visit to India in April, (ostensibly to watch an Indo-Pak ODI), the visit of a high-powered FICCI-FLO business delegation to Pakistan came at a rather opportune time. A 90-member industry delegation, including 12 FLO members from all over India, participated in the trail-blazing visit to Karachi, Islamabad and Lahore from May 23-28, 2005.

During this visit, FLO President Usha Agarwala met General Parvez Musharraf, along with other office bearers of FICCI. The discussion emphasized on regularizing VISA policies, security of investment by Indian businesses in Pakistan, joint ventures in a range of sectors, among other things.

FLO was requested to take initiative for developing business contacts and subsequently signed a MOU with Women Entrepreneurs Committee of FPCCI, Karachi. The highlights of the MOU range from cooperation in trade, investment services, education and empowerment of women.









EXECUTIVE COMMITTEE MEETING OF SAARC CHAMBER WOMEN ENTREPRENEURS COUNCIL (SCWEC)

Kathmandu: June 3-4, 2005

An Executive Committee Meeting of SCWEC was held at Kathmandu on 3-4 June 2005.

Ms Usha Agarwala, President, FLO and Vice-President of SCWEC participated the meet at Kathmandu along with Ms Renuka Shah from Kolkata one of the founder members of SCWEC.

The discussion highlighted the future-working plan of SCWEC with special reference to: promotion of crafts and its upgradation, exchange of ideas, services and products between the countries, exchange of entrepreneurial skills and knowledge among women entrepreneurs and economic empowerment of the women in the SAARC Region. And also the best practices of one country to be replicated in other countries.

During the Executive Committee the SCWEC logo was also formally launched. Dr. Tulsi Giri, Hon'ble Vice-Chairman of Council of Ministries, Nepal unveiled the Logo.

FLO-RUI EDU CAFÉ 2005, THE FIRST-EVER EDUCATION COUNSELING AND CAREER SEMINAR EXCLUSIVELY FOR GIRL STUDENTS

New Delhi: June 17-18, 2005

Inaugurating the FICCI Ladies Organisation (FLO) –Rai University 'Edu Café', the first ever education counseling and career seminar exclusively for girl students in the capital, the Chief Guest Ms Girija Vyas asked people to seriously engage in

counseling to equip women to realize their individuality and attain equality of opportunity and economic rights. "The harsh reality is that education, counseling and execution have remained the weakest links in empowering women and making them aware of their rights and responsibilities."

Responding to the observations by Ms Usha Agarwala, President, FLO, pointed out that women in India have to work twice as harder than their male counterparts to prove themselves. She also emphasized that a right choice of education for a girl child is intrinsic and indispensable to sustain economic growth.

Edu café 2005 organized interactive sessions on various career options namely Management Media & Communications, Biotechnology, Engineering, IT & ITES, Hotels & Restaurants, Fashion, Modeling and Entertainment.





CAN MERE ENACTMENT OF LAWS - ENSURE WOMEN'S SECURITY SUFFICIENTLY?

New Delhi: July 7, 2005

It is evident that Law plays a very pivotal role in the existence of mankind. It brings in uniformity in its treatment. To throw light on this FLO organised a Panel Discussion on 'Can Mere Enactment of Laws Ensure Women's Security sufficiently?' 'He is a visionary,' she said, 'who is determined to change the face of India by turning the aviation sector into a boon and giving Indian travelers the triple treat of affordability, availability and connectivity.'



The session concluded with Ms. Shereen Bhan, the Associate Editor, CNBC giving her closing remarks.

MISSION KASHMIR 'EARTHQUAKE RELIEF COLLECTION CAMP'

October 20, 2005

Calamity struck in the month of October, 2005 as India and Pakistan experienced a major earthquake of the magnitude of 7.6 on Richter Scale. A total of 147 aftershocks were registered on the first day after the initial quake. The epicenter was Pakistan-occupied- Kashmir (POK) and it was estimated that damages incurred were well over Rs 30 billion.

Relief efforts in many remote villages on the Indian side of Kashmir were hampered as roads were buried in rubble and many affected areas remained inaccessible. There was no power,

adequate food or water and also the danger of disease spreading.

The magnitude of this disaster was so vast that the Government alone could not provide relief. Hence, many voluntary organizations and NGO's came forward to provide assistance. YFLO also appealed to its members to donate essential items. We collected hundreds of blankets, foodgrains, salt and sugar, tea bags, woollens, tents, toys and books and utensils. These were then donated by the YFLO committee to NGO Rahat which was actively involved in the relief efforts.

July 30, 2005





THE HANNS SEIDEL FOUNDATION IN INDIA

The HANNS-SEIDEL-FOUNDATION (HSF) is named after the late Dr. Hanns Seidel (1901 - 1961). He was the Chief Minister of Bavaria (1957 - 1960) and Party Chairman (1955 to 1961) of the Christian Social Union (CSU).

The HSF was founded in 1966 in Munich and has the legal form of a registered society. It is one of the youngest amongst the four German Foundations in India.

The Foundation has Liaison Offices in 54 countries and single Project Offices in about 8 centers world wide.

The HSF receives grants from the Federal Republic of Germany and the Free State of Bavaria; its activities are non-commercial, non-profit-making and its accounts are subject to constant monitoring by the Federal Audit Office.

The Foundation has five wings: (1) The Academy for Political Science and Contemporary History; (2) The Institute for Adult Civic Education; (3) The Institute for Foreign Relations; (4) The Scholarship Organization; and (5) The Institute for International Contact and Co-operation, which is represented in India through its Liaison Office in New Delhi.

The "Institute for International Contact and Cooperation" functions overseas; we are in India since 1996 and cooperating with the FICCI Ladies Organization (FLO), which is our active partner. Our endeavor is to promote the principle of "self help". The partner-organization has not only to be on the receiving end, but contributing as well. Only through this kind of joint effort, we feel, could a dialogue become purposeful between India and Germany.

Objectives:

With a view to promoting knowledge and awareness, the HSF supports projects in the areas of community development, education, health and environmental awareness, management training and institution building. The HSF also provides support for Seminars, Symposia and Presentations, in order to help people to help themselves, and further up-date their qualifications, skills and capabilities. The Foundation's educational programs are intended to: (i) invoke thought process and provide motivation and awareness for independent action; and (ii) train the participants to enhance their level of competence, so that they become self-reliant and capable of handling their professional problems with confidence.

For the smooth conduct of the programs, suitable and qualified Faculty is drafted from India and Germany - Faculty, which has didactic experience and those who are recognized experts in their respective fields.

Since 1996 the Foundation has been extending support for about 35-40 projects annually. These educational workshops & training programs, proposed by the FLO, are mainly for women, and spread all over India; the three broad categories receiving our support are: (1) Grass-root level or income generation projects for the unemployed and for the artisans and craftpersons; (2) Middle level or skill development workshops for the educated youth; and (3) Senior level or skill enhancement programs for the managerial groups.

From 1996 up to the end of 2005, nearly 11800 participants from all over India have taken advantage of some 285 training programmes/workshops/seminars and symposia, organized by FLO and supported by HSF.

ART APPRECIATION / BUYING/ SELLING/ CONSERVATION & RESTORATION OF PAINTINGS - A CAREER OPTION

New Delhi: April 29-30, 2005

In the art world, there have been an astonishing range of innovations during the last few decades. Although art in traditional media is still being created, we now also see art made of mixed media components, art of assemblage, installation and art that is ephemeral. Artists are today increasingly working with and responding to a variety of materials, choosing the medium that best fulfils their creative goals
