Anuradha Goel, the then President, appraised the Honourable President of India about the activities of FLO and highlighted the projects that she initiated during the Silver Jubilee year.






100 Easy Secrets Of Success

Dr. Mathew Varghese, MS, Head, Department of Orthopaedics, St. Stephen's Hospital, Delhi, and Dr. Sandeep Malhotra, M.D., F.A.C.S., Consultant - Laparoscopic General and Bariatric Surgery, Artemis Health Sciences, were the speakers.

Dr. Sandeep Malhotra gave a crisp presentation on Obesity - disease of the affluent in India. Dr. Mathew Varghese, Former Director and current Head of Orthopaedics Department at the St. Stephen's Hospital, followed with a detailed presentation on ageing bones





and joints. He mentioned the causes, the available treatments, the effectiveness of drug therapy and the importance of a balanced diet, exercising, aerobics, tai chi, and brisk walking in preventing ageing-related bones and joints disorders.








Rights And Responsibilities

The delegates also met officials at the Swedish Trade Council, New Delhi.





The event was well covered by the media. Snippets appeared in Hindustan, Mid-Day, The Political and Business Daily, and Nai Dunia.











Ms Neerja Birla, who serves as a Director on the Aditya Birla Group Companies and is passionate about children, education and


the performing arts spoke about how spirituality enabled her to gracefully conduct her life harmoniously.

The Speaker for the day was Mr. T.N.Seshan, Former Chief Election Commissioner for the Country.




Addressing the ladies Mr.Seshan made suggestions for Better Elections and in his Trademark style spoke about the state of Governance in the country.

Seshan stressed the need to tap young talent and also elaborated the need for


better infrastructure and liberalization of education and health.



To celebrate World Food Day, we visited a Girls' orphanage and arranged Lunch and Dinner for the inmates.



The Interstate was successfully held in Coimbatore with a total of 60 delegates coming in from other chapters.









The Bio Disc has been evaluated by various institutions and is known to reduce water surface tension value.



IIM A workshop on 23rd and 24th of Feb was the second such workshop which I attended, the earlier being at ISB Hyderabad in Nov 2008.

To say that these workshops have been an eyeopener would be a gross understatement.

It must have been quite a challenge for the IIM faculty to formulate a course for us since our group was fairly eclectic both in age profile as well as academic qualifications.

We had successful young girls in their twenties to thirties with the eldest of us in mid fifties, also few of us were PhD's in diverse fields of Mathematics and Holistic learning and a few of us had not been able to finish our graduation also. But all of us had one thing in common and that was the zest to learn, to interact and to take away as much as one can from this opportunity. IIM came up to and beyond our expectations.

The modules taken up by Dr Parvinder Gupta on leadership, business communication, women and leadership and working together gave us an insight and perception which we had not explored earlier in our relationship within our work environment. Her energy and enthusiasm was totally infectious.

Dr Dixit's case study on Kanpur confectionary taught us to read within and beyond the fine print and also that finances are very important in formulating strategy.

We had never imagined that we would be interacting with a professor of such eminence as Dr Sameer Barua, his lecture on corporate governance taught me and many of us the intricacies of formulation, management and running of company's Board of Directors. Dr Deodhar was quick to judge that his audience had little interest in India's economic environment and was happy interacting with us on various economic issues.

We look forward to again avail of the opportunity to learn from one of the best faculty in the world, it is truly an absolutely commendable effort on part of FLO to provide this platform to its members and I can only recommend other members to come forward and learn, grow and be a WOMAN OF TODAY AND THE FUTURE.

The Hanns Seidel Foundation

The HANNS SEIDEL FOUNDATION (HSF) is named after the late Dr. Hanns Seidel (1901-1961). He was the Chief Minister of Bavaria (1957-1960) and Party Chairman (1955-1961) of the Christian Social Union (CSU).

The HSF was founded in 1966 in Munich and has the legal form of a registered society. It is one of the youngest amongst the five German Foundations in India.

The foundation has Liaison Offices in 54 countries and single Project officers in about 8 centers worldwide.

For activities abroad, the HSF receives grants from the Federal Republic of Germany. These activities are non-commercial, non-profit-making and are subject to constant monitoring by the Federal Audit Office.

The Foundation has five wings:

- 1. The Academy for Political Science and Contemporary History.
- 2. The Institute for Adult Civic Education
- 3. The Institute for Foreign Relations
- 4. The Scholarship Organization
- The institute for International Contact and Co-operation, which is represented in India through its Liaison Office in New Delhi.

The "Institute for International Contact and Co-operation" functions abroad; we are in India since 1996 and presently cooperating with the FICCI Ladies Organisation and with four other Indian Non-Government Organizations. Our endeavour is to promote the principles of social and political dialogue and "self help". The partner organizations have not only to be on the receiving end, but contributing as well. Through this kind of joint effort, we feel dialogue between India and Germany can become more and more purposeful.

Objectives: With a view to promoting knowledge and awareness, the HSF supports projects in the areas of international political dialogue, community development, education, health and environmental awareness, management training and Institution building. The HSF also provides support for seminars, symposia and workshops in order to help people update their qualifications, skills and capabilities. The Foundation's educational programs are intended to: (1) invoke thought process and provide motivation and awareness for responsible independent action; and (2) to train the participants to enhance their level of competence, so that they become self-reliant, responsible and capable of handling their professional problems with confidence.

For the smooth conduct of the programs, suitable and qualified faculty is drafted from India and Germany faculty, which has didactic experience and those who are recognized experts in their respective fields.

Since 1996 the Foundation has been extending support annually for about 35-40 activities proposed by FLO. These educational workshops and training programs are mainly for women, and are spread all over India; the three broad categories receiving our assistance are: (1) Grass root level or income generation projects for the unemployed and for the artisans and crafts persons; (2) Middle level or skill development workshops for the educated youth and (3) Senior level or skill enhancement programs for the managerial groups.



Dr Eric Pearl from Los Angeles was here on November 4 to address a seminar on reconnective healing. The event was organised by FLO, the women's wing of FICCI, in collaboration with Health Awareness Centre and Timeswellness.com

The onset of November in Mumbal saw Los Angeles' Dr Eric Pearl, a self-proclaimed newage healer at the Nehru Centre.
Pearl held a 12-year practice as a chiropractor before he discovered a spectrum of light energy that he is able to transmit through his hands. This energy he claims has healed several people of diseases such as

several people of diseases such as cancer and AIDS-related symptoms. Pearl has been practising this technique since 1993. He travels across countries, holding three day

long workshops and has touched 70, 000 people across 70 countries who can now access this spectrum of energy to heal people. He calls his technique 'Reconnective healing' and claims that it is different from other forms of healing like Reiki.

During the seminar, Pearl said that all other forms of alternative healing have based themselves sole ly on technique but reconnective healing is about transcending the technique. He also says that recon-nective healing is instantaneous and lasts for a lifetime

He demonstrated this by calling on a volunteer from the audience, a young Indian girl who called herself Ubaldine and cured her of a scar-ring post-surgery effect on her shoulders that did not allow her to lift her arms beyond a point. After the demonstration, the girl could lift her arms.


He went on to explain that this healing technique draws on the in-telligence of the universe and represents the evolution of humanity

The CWEC is one of the Product and Service Councils of CACCI. It was formerly organized in November, 2006 during the 40th anniversary of CACCI in Taipei. The primary objective of CWEC is of providing a forum for women entrepreneurs of CACCI member countries to network with each other, explore and promote business ventures among its members and work for the growth and development of women in the region.

The CACCI Women Entrepreneurs Council CWEC organized a special session during the 23rd CACCI Conference held on May, 31st - June 1, 2009 in Yokohama, Japan. Chaired by Mrs. Mukta Nandini Jain – Chairperson CWEC and Past President FLO, the special session attracted a sizeable number of women entrepreneurs from Japan, Philippines and Mongolia.



All present desired CWEC to create further such opportunities to meet and interact to enhance mutual understanding, co-operation and business opportunities.

CWEC successfully conducted a marketing workshop in Jakarta on Dec'08. 52 local delegates listened to the presentations, exchanged views, and shared experiences on topics related to the workshop theme, namely, "Effective Marketing Strategy: Domestic and International."

The primary workshop speaker was Mr. Aseem Bhatia, Director at the Foreign Trade Development Center in New Delhi, India. Mr. Bhatia, who is a marketing expert and also manages his own export business.
