FOREWORD

As my tenure as the 19th President of FICCI Ladies Organisation comes to an end, I realize more and more how inspiring and enlightening this office has been for me and what a tremendous platform it has accorded to me for learning and personal growth. I am indebted to Mrs. Indira Dutt, Mrs. Usha Krishna and all the Past Presidents for nominating me to this national office.



FICCI Ladies Organisation is the only national forum of women and FOR women which enjoys a credibility and branding that few organizations do, due to its affiliation to FICCI and the hard work and contribution put into it by the Past Presidents.

The true color of India is still 90 % rural . Thus, although the process of the mainstreaming of empowered women has commenced, there is still an urgent need to incorporate more and more women into awareness and educational programs for economic and personal growth in both urban and non urban areas. This year, I translated this perception into my theme, EXTENSION and travelled to Mumbai, Pune, Vadodara, Hyderabad,

Coimabatore, Kolkata and Ranchi with a slide presentation on FLO and its activities to incorporate more members into FLO. The purpose was to spread the FLO activities through local chapters in various states.

For the first time, the western region of India was activated with Mumbai becoming a full fledged chapter of FLO. Hyderabad also became a chapter. More than one hundred and fifty new members joined the fold. My personal interaction with many small entrepreneurs brought up several problem areas which, I hope, FLO will focus on in the years to come, e.g., the dire need for access to micro credit and marketing facilities.

Another first time for FLO this year is the signing of the first Memorandum of Understanding with a like minded women's organization in a foreign country. This is the result of the delegation I took to Bangladesh and very successful meetings with the Women Entrepreneurs Association of Bangladesh (WEAB) and the Federation of Bangladesh Chambers of Commerce and Industry as also with the Ministers of Commerce, Industry, Education and Foreign Affairs in Bangladesh.

During this year, FLO had to face the closure of its long term socio-economic project, a tailoring and embroidery institute for slum children at Dakshinpuri; the emerging circumstances had rendered this project un-viable.

To channelise and harness women power into entrepreneurial activities which will inspire them to start an enterprise of their own, we were able to organize around 35 workshops and training programmes with Hanns Seidel Foundation (HSF), Germany including smaller cities and rural areas. Our gratitude to Mr R Babel, Director, South Asia, HSF, Munich, Germany and Mr B K Puri, HSF's Liaision Officer in India for their generosity and invaluable support.



I have benefited greatly by regular inputs on the working of FLO this year by the Governing Body members and Past Presidents. I thank them all sincerely,

My thanks to the Immediate past President , Dr. (Mrs.) Kusum Ansal and Vice President , Mrs. Chandra Garodia for inspiring me to explore my creative and efficiency levels at all times.

To my Treasurer, Mrs. Namita Gautam, a very sincere debt of gratitude for always being helpful and quietly supportive and for her invaluable guidance.

Without the Executive Secretary, Mrs. Shipra Chatterjee, I would not have been able to work from my native city, Chennai. I thank her warmly for always standing by me, making my work a rewarding experience with her efficiency, hard work and moral support at every stage.

I thank Mrs. L. Varghese for so thoroughly and thoughtfully executing all the administrative work of the FLO office and for her co-operation and sincerity of purpose; to Kirti, Ruchi and Dalip, a very warm thank you for all their help.

I also wish to place on record my sincere debt of gratitude to Dr. Amit Mitra, Secretary General,

FICCI, Dr. A.C. Muthiah, President, FICCI and Mr. R.S. Lodha, Immediate Past President, FICCI for their unstinted help and support to me this year. It has been a pleasure and a privilege to interact with them.

Kasturba Gandhi Kanya Gurukulam, Vedraniam, the dream project of the Salt Satyagrahi Sardar A Vedaratnam and his son Padmashri V Appakutti, was established in 1946 for the upliftment of downtrodden women in the field of education and training in various crafts and industries.

Award to Outstanding Woman Professional

The award was given to Mrs. Padma Madhuranath, Scientist-F, National Aerospace Laboratories, Bangalore. She is the Group Leader of Flight Simulation

Group, Flight Mechanics and Controls Division. She has made an outstanding contribution and is perhaps one of the very few women in the world, in the area of flight simulation of a combat aircraft.

1999-2000

Award for Outstanding Woman Entrepreneur

FLO award to Outstanding Woman Entrepreneur for the year 1999-2000 has been awarded to Ms. Sushila Devi Tikmany.

She started "PITAMBARI" as a small venture with only two women in 1968, with the noble objective of helping refugee women from Bangladesh, to earn their livelihood and restore their dignity.

Award for Outstanding Woman Social Worker

FLO award to Outstanding Woman Social Worker for the year 1999-2000 has been awarded to Ms. Swaraj Lata Goel.

Ms. Swaraj Lata Goel is currently the Proprietor, Deep Gas Service, Mathura; Chairperson, Brij Bhumi Sewa Santhan; Project Director, Aamar Badi; Vrindaban, and Regional Convener, INTACH of Brij Bhumi Regional Chapter.

2000-2001

Award for Outstanding Woman Professional

Ms Akhila Srinivasan, is currently the Managing Director of Shriram Investments Limited (SIL). SIL is an important member of the Rs. 3,000 crores Shriram Group, headquartered at Chennai.

Ms Akhila joined the Shriram Group in 1986 as a Management Trainee, right after completing her M.Phil in Economics. In recognition of her hard work and demonstrated organizing abilities, she was appointed as Marketing Manager in 1987, when S I L had a Deposit Portfolio of about Rs 10 crores. Today, SIL has a Deposit / Debenture Portfolio of Rs 1,400 crores, 125 branches and asset base of Rs 850 crores.

2000-2001

Award for Outstanding Institution - Women Welfare

Pratidhi is a collaborative society of Delhi Police



and Association for Development a registered NGO of social work professionals. It is perhaps the first agency of its kind in the country that takes a holistic approach and answers long felt requirement of providing welfare services to crime victims like those of sexual abuse, domestic violence, fatal accident, murder and suicide and its beneficiaries are women, men, children and the clientele includes both the victims and their families.

2001-02

Award for Outstanding Woman Entrepreneur

FLO award to Outstanding Woman Entrepreneur for the year 2001-02 has been awarded to **MS MANJU JALOTA**, Director of Alankrit, Lucknow.

MS MANU JALOTA, has been a Teacher for 14 years in the coveted Institution of St. Francis College, Lucknow, and the Head of Department of Geography and History on ICSE panel was driven to meet the challenges and panges of economic disparity towards the artisans of the village folk in the lands of Nawabs of Awadh. She started regularly visiting some villages of the collection arena of workers and gradually it spread to 35 villages where exclusive works are being done by about 1000 artisans in the areas of – Tailoring, Zardozi, Printing, and Dyeing.

Workers, in her company are groomed, initiated and helped economically, and also encouraged for R & D technology improvement.

2001-2002

Award for Outstanding Woman Social Worker

FLO award to Outstanding Woman Social Worker for the year 2001-02 has been awarded to MRS NEETA BAHADUR, Founder President of **Drishti Samajik Sansthan, Lucknow.**

DRISHTI is an NGO working for the welfare of all types of disabled mentally challenged, physically handicapped, deaf & dumb and persons suffering from multiple disabilities.

DRISHTI'S work started in 1990 at Government Blind School, Mohan Road (Kakori), which is about 20 kilometers away from Lucknow city. Mrs Bahadur helped

over 100 blind students with establishing an audio cassette library. She prepared around 400 cassettes in her own voice comprising of the syllabus from class III to Intermediate and provided 10 cassette recorders also. With the help of a manual brailler, Mrs Bahadur prepared around 400 books of syllabus in braille script and donated them to Government Blind Schools.

After that, DRISHTI established a Vocational Training Centre in the Blind School premises at Mohan Road, providing free training to over 200 blind as well as to physically handicapped children in typing, shorthand, music, candle making, stitching, embroidery, weaving, horticulture, etc.

Many of her students have got jobs in the State, Central Government offices and Public Sector Units, and many of them have joined in State Bank of India and hundreds of them have started their own businesses. Some of them are working in factories and shops as skilled workers also.

Kaizen is a Japanese word implying gradual, orderly and continuous improvement in personal life, social life and working life. KAI means "to break apart" and ZEN means " to religiously improve".

Practising continuous change and improvement through Kaizen methods in the work place would:

- a. Improve customer satisfaction,
- b. Reduce overall costs,
- c. Improve quality,
- d. Reduce wastage,
- e. Enhance competitive advantage,
- f. Assure a safer work area.

This involves everyone, managers and workers alike.

Kaizen, according to Mr Chandran, was responsible for the revolutionary turn around in the Japanese industry in the 1960s. He mentioned the five S's of Kaizen, which are:

- 1. Sort out What you do not need,
- 2. Straighten out things and place them in an orderly fashion,
- 3. Sweep out, clean and review performance,
- 4. Standardize i.e. an Audit of Operations,
- 5. Self discipline and training.

"Work smarter and not harder" was his "Mantra" (slogan) for the evening.



PANEL DISCUSSION ON PREVENTIVE HEALTH CARE


New Delhi: October 8, 2002

The seminar was very well organized and attended and one which, for the first time brought together senior professionals of companies like Hindustan Lever, Proctor & Gamble, Tata Tea, Nutrine, Pepsico, Asian Paints, Castrol etc to address this issue on a common platform. Also participating were-Mr Javed Ahmed, Joint Commissioner of Police who talked about the role of the police and Mr Justice D Y Chandrachud of the Mumbai High

Court who gave his assessments on the present legal systems relevant to this issue.

Mr. Bharat Patel, Chairman of Procter & Gamble, who is also heading the FICCI Brand Protection Committee, informed us that counterfeit products have the same look as the original, while pass-offs on the other hand, may have a similar, but not identical sounding name, logo and package design. Fakes are especially indistinguishable from the real, when the counterfeiters recycle the original packaging.

There was an exhibition of Fake vs Real products that was set up, and created a lot of interest in the viewers. It was truly a shocking revelation that one out of three products that we might be buying as a consumer might be a fake!!

FELLOWSHIP MEET & TALK BY MR RAMAKRISHNA OF LARAS

Chennai: February 12, 2003

On 12th February 2003, Mr. Ramakrishna of LARAS spoke to FICCI Ladies Organisation on a very interesting topic, "So Whats Your Excuse?" He spoke on how the responsibility of changing oneself lay within each of us. What was required was self-belief. "Ask, "he said" and whatever you want will be yours". Self-esteem is the net result of one's levels of self-worth, self confidence and self awareness. He outlined several ways of bringing about change in one's life. He narrated a wonderful story of how each one of us is in fact a gold mine waiting to be discovered.

Mumbai: February 19, 2003

On 19th February 2003, FLO Bombay Chapter organized a seminar on "Cancer Awareness: Cancer Prevention" for the benefit of those who did not have a brush with this disease. New Delhi : February 26, 2003

The coalition government is perceived by some to be more democratic, and hence fairer, because it represents a much broader spectrum of public opinion than government by one party alone. In almost all coalitions, a majority of citizens voted for the parties which form the government and so their views and interests are represented in political decision-making.

Speaking at the Panel Discussion on The Politics of Coalition: Progressive or Regressive organized by FICCI Ladies Organisation, Mr Ravi Shankar Prasad, Honourable Minister of State for Information & Broadcasting (Independent Charge) Govt. of India stressed the need for 'reciprocity' and 'responsibility', which he felt would enable the establishment of a basic trust between the Coalition partners.

Reiterating Mr Amar Singh's views of a pre-poll coalition, he avered that this could pave the way for progress, commitment, stability, understanding and better communication.

According to Mr Nilotpal Basu, M P, CPI(M), given the nature of Indian states, coalition has become an inevitable reality and therefore, preference should be given to evolving policies acceptable to all parties forming the coalition.

Addressing the meeting, Mr Praful Patel, Leader and Spokesperson of the National Conference Party expressed his view that coalition politics was here to stay for the next twenty years if not more and therefore ,whether progressive or regressive, the country did not have a choice.



The HANNS-SEIDEL-FOUNDATION (HSF) is named after the late Dr. Hanns Seidel (1901 - 1961). He was the Chief Minister of Bavaria (1957 - 1960) and Party Chairman (1955 to 1961) of the Christian Social Union (CSU).

The HSF was founded in 1966 in Munich and has the legal form of a registered society. It is one of the youngest amongst the four German Foundations in India.

The Foundation has Liaison Offices in 54 countries and single Project Offices in about 8 centers world wide.

The HSF receives grants from the Federal Republic of Germany and the Free State of Bavaria; its activities are non-commercial, non-profit-making and its accounts are subject to constant monitoring by the Federal Audit Office.

The Foundation has five wings: (1) The Academy for Political Science and Contemporary History; (2) The Institute for Adult Civic Education; (3) The Institute for Foreign Relations; (4) The Scholarship Organization; and (5) The Institute for International Contact and Co-operation, which is represented in India through its Liaison Office in New Delhi.

The "Institute for International Contact and Cooperation" functions overseas; we are in India since 1996 and cooperating with the FICCI Ladies Organization (FLO), which is our active partner. Our endeavor is to promote the principle of "self help". The partner-organization has not only to be on the receiving end, but contributing as well. Only through this kind of joint effort, we feel, could a dialogue become purposeful between India and Germany.

Objectives:

With a view to promoting knowledge and awareness, the HSF supports projects in the areas of community development, education, health and environmental awareness, management training and institution building. The HSF also provides support for Seminars, Symposia and Presentations, in order to help people to help themselves, and further up-date their qualifications, skills and capabilities. The Foundation's educational programs are intended to: (i) invoke thought process and provide motivation and awareness for independent action; and (ii) train the participants to enhance their level of competence, so that they become self-reliant and capable of handling their professional problems with confidence.

For the smooth conduct of the programs, suitable and qualified Faculty is drafted from India and Germany - Faculty, which has didactic experience and those who are recognized experts in their respective fields.

Since 1996 the Foundation has been extending support for about 35-40 projects annually. These educational workshops & training programs, proposed by the FLO, are mainly for women, and spread all over India; the three broad categories receiving our support are: (1) Grass-root level or income generation projects for the unemployed and for the artisans and craftpersons; (2) Middle level or skill development workshops for the educated youth; and (3) Senior level or skill enhancement programs for the managerial groups.

From 1996 and up to the end of April 2003, nearly 8700 participants from all over India have taken advantage of some 215 training programs/workshops/seminars and symposia, organized by the FLO, and supported by this Foundation.




