23rd Annual Session



FLO celebrated its 23rd Annual Session at FICCI, New Delhi. There was a very interesting panel discussion chaired by MP Najma Heptullah.

In the main event, it was an honour to welcome Naina Lal Kidwai, CEO, HSBC, Mumbai, as the Chief Guest on the occasion. She addressed the members and invitees on

"Growth Development and Opportunity through Women Empowerment in Rural India" with a very informative presentation.

The session concluded with the taking over ceremony of the incoming President of FLO Kiran Gera. Seema Jajodia was a p p o i n t e d t h e n e w Chairperson of YFLO Delhi, for the year 2007-08.







Domestic Delegation to Assam and Arunachal Pradesh

FLO travelled to the easternmost state, Arunachal Pradesh, from 15th to 22nd May. The group of 20 members assembled in Kolkata and flew to Tezpur, where they stayed at the restored colonial Mcleod Russel Tea Garden Bungalow. From Tezpur, the group explored an orchid sanctuary and travelled on to Tenga, where the Army hosted them. Here they visited the Ball of Fire Defence Museum and Chillipam, a monastery under construction by the Army. The delegation proceeded to the Sela Pass, which is at the height of 14,000 feet. Thereafter, climbing past the towns of Bomdila and Dirang, they arrived at the



picturesque town of Tawang. Here the delegation visited the oldest monastery, an exclusive nunnery for women monks and negotiated the most treacherous terrain to reach Bumla, on the Indo-China border at 17,000 feet.



FLO members were very heartened by the work being done at the Manjushree School for handicapped children and orphans, and each member donated Rs. 5,000/- on the spot, bringing up FLO's contribution to Rs. one lakh. The delegates also met the local entrepreneurs, army officers and district administrators. Members from FLO all-India bonded in this unusual but exhilarating travel experience, courtesy the hospitality of our Army.









Seminar on International Business and Challenges SCWEC Inaugural Session

As Vice Chairperson India, Kiran Gera, President FLO, attended the inaugural session SAARC Chamber of Women Entrepreneurs Council. Governor of Tamil Nadu, Shri Surjit Singh Barnala, was the Chief Guest. The program was attended by delegates from other SAARC countries. Indira Dutt, Chairperson of SCWEC, a past President of FLO, presided. Kiran Gera presented a paper on "Marketing dilemmas of women entrepreneurs: Case Studies from SAARC

Region".



Annual Convention on Legislative Action on Women's Issues

FLO President Kiran Gera was invited to present a paper on Corporate Policies on Protection of Women against Sexual Harassment at Work. There were several distinguished speakers at the Convention including the Chief of ILO, former Chief Justice of India, Justice Verma who promulgated the "Vishakha Guidelines", the frame work of legislation regarding sexual harassment of women at work. The Convention was held in New Delhi in August 2007.



Meeting with Hon. Renuka Choudhury Minister for Women and Child Development



Around 30 FLO members met Ms Renuka Choudhury, Women and Child Development Minister at her Lodhi Road residence on April 6, 2007. The objective of the meeting was to take up the cause of the girl child. Ms Kiran Gera, President FLO, briefed the minister about the nationwide initiative — 'Save the Girl Child' to be launched by the organisation in partnership with UNFPA, corporates and the government. FLO members from various Chapters across the country attended the meeting.

Norwegian Women Entrepreneurs

FLO hosted the Norwegian Women Entrepreneurs' Delegation to India in Delhi and by our Chapters in Bombay and Chennai as well. In Delhi, the program was chaired by Hon. Union Minister Anand Sharma and attended by the Norwegian Commercial Attaché. The delegates were welcomed with tilak and marigold flowers to give them a taste of Indian welcome. Fifteen women entrepreneurs from various fields which includes hydropower, glass manufacturing, software, engineering, IT & ICT, training, handicrafts, baby products, cotton and silk yarn (ecologically grown), silver jewellery, T-shirts, hemp products, towel and many more. A huge amount of efforts was done by FLO to ensure a large number of business-to-business meetings in all the three cities. A candlelight dinner was hosted by past President Sarparveen Kaur in Delhi. Executive Director Shipra Chatterjee, Bombay Chapter Chairperson Vinita Bimbhet and Chennai Chapter Chairperson Akhila Srinivasan did a commendable job in hosting this delegation.





World Islamic Economic Forum Kuala Lumpur, Malaysia

A FLO delegation headed by Kiran Gera, President FLO, attended the WIEF Businesswomen Forum from May 27 to May 29 in Kuala Lumpur. The global conference was attended by women delegates from 27 countries like Pakistan, Qatar, Nigeria, England, UAE, Turkey, Iran, etc. This businesswomen coming from very affluent Islamic countries have great affinity to India and its products. This gave FLO a huge opportunity to explore new relationships and business opportunities.

FLO also met with FWEAM, the Federation of Women Entrepreneur Associates of Malaysia. The delegates also visited the historical town of Melaka. The gracious High Commissioner of India, Mr. Ashok Kamath, hosted a reception at his residence for the Indian delegates.

Seminar on Hypnotherapy

A workshop on Hypnotherapy, the non-invasive process of healing, was organized by FLO on Thursday, August 16, 2007, in New Delhi.

Hypnotherapy is the use of hypnosis in the treatment of certain ailments. Three experts from the Institute of Hypnotherapy of India conducted the workshop. The workshop threw light on how does hypnotherapy work, how it helps in stressmanagement and physical ailments and how is hypnotherapy different from other established schools of medication. The speakers presented case studies and also took the participants through a practical session of self-hypnosis.

Delegation to Portugal, Spain and Morocco






A 39-member FLO Delegation to Portugal, Spain and Morocco was led by Ms. Kiran Gera, President, FLO.




International Women's Day Celebration Supporting Partnerships: Is There A Man Behind Every Successful Woman?

A very comprehensive presentation was made by our National Treasurer, Ranjana Agarwal, who is a qualified Chartered Accountant. Other inputs came from Anuradha Goel, Senior Vice President and Anuja Narain, governing body member, both in business as an exporters. The role and work of FLO was applauded by Ms Renuka Choudhury in the press



conference, where she singled out our organisation amongst various others that accompanied her to the FM.

Women's Rights Domestic Violence and HIV/AIDS Protection of Women Act, 2005










YFLO organised an informative and interactive session on the subjects of women's rights and the use of popular media for creating awareness on issues such as HIV/AIDS and violence against women.



The child sex ratio is a powerful indicator of social health of any society. The sex ratio at birth is slightly favourable to boys. This means that more boys are born as compared to girls. This is a natural phenomenon. The sex ratio at birth is usually between 940–950 girls per 1000 boys. Over the years, this ratio has fallen from 976 in 1961, to 964 in 1971 and 962 in 1981.

Based on the final results of Census 2001, in states such as Haryana, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Delhi, Gujarat and Chandigarh this ratio has declined to less than 900 girls per 1000 boys. The ratio stands at a mere 771 in Kurukshetra district of Haryana,

836 in Ahmedabad, and 846 in the south-west district of Delhi – even though these regions are amongst the most prosperous in the country.

A stage will soon come when it would be extremely difficult, if not impossible, to make up for the missing girls. Society needs to recognize this discrimination: girls have a right to live just as boys do. Moreover, missing numbers of both sex, and the resulting imbalance, can destroy the social and human fabric as we know it. Contrary to what many people believe, lesser number of girls in society will not enhance their status. We passionately believe that in empowering the woman lies the power to shift the balance towards wanting a girl child as much as a boy child. It has been argued that there is no better route for this than the field of arts, be it music or film.

Our annual function Phir Wahi Sham this year was Hamari Betiyon Ke Naam. A unique musical evening that was held on the 19th of January, 2008, at the Jamshedji Bhabha Theatre, NCPA, Nariman Point, Mumbai. The auditorium was packed to the hilt, the program got delayed thanks to the stars and celebrities being deluged by media, press, radio and television.

It was rare opportunity for all of us to meet some of the biggest stars and their daughters, walk down memory lane and share their personal memories of those times. Through the presentation of songs/interview/audio presentations we felicitated the stars on their innumerable achievements as an actress, a wife and most importantly as the mother of a girl child.

The Hanns Seidel Foundation

The HANNS SEIDEL FOUNDATION (HSF) is named after the late Dr. Hanns Seidel (1901–1961). He was the Chief Minister of Bavaria (1957–1960) and Party Chairman (1955–1961) of the Christian Social Union (CSU).

The HSF was founded in 1966 in Munich and has the legal form of a registered society. It is one of the youngest amongst the five German Foundations in India.

The foundation has Liaison Offices in 54 countries and single Project officers in about 8 centres worldwide.

For activities abroad, the HSF receives grants from the Federal Republic of Germany. These activities are non-commercial, non-profit-making and are subject to constant monitoring by the Federal Audit Office.

The Foundation has fivewings:

- 1) The Academy for Political Science and Contemporary History
- 2) The Institute for Adult Civic Education
- 3) The Institute for Foreign Relations
- 4) The Scholarship Organization
- 5) The Institute for International Contact and Co-operation, which is represented in India through its Liaison Office in New Delhi.

The "Institute for International Contact and Co-operation" functions abroad; we are in India since 1996 and presently cooperating with the FICCI Ladies Organization and with four other Indian Non-Government Organizations. Our endeavour is to promote the principles of social and political dialogue and "self help". The partner organizations have not only to be on the receiving end, but contributing as well. Through this kind of joint effort, we feel dialogue between India and Germany can become more and more purposeful.

Objectives: With a view to promoting knowledge and awareness, the HSF supports projects in the areas of international political dialogue, community development, education, health and environmental awareness, management training and Institution building. The HSF also provides support for seminars, symposia and workshops in order to help people update their qualifications, skills and capabilities. The Foundation's educational programs are intended to: (1) invoke thought process and provide motivation and awareness for responsible independent action; and (2) to train the participants to enhance their level of competence, so that they become self-reliant, responsible and capable of handling their professional problems with confidence.

For the smooth conduct of the programs, suitable and qualified faculty is drafted from India and Germany faculty, which has didactic experience and those who are recognized experts in their respective fields.

Since 1996 the Foundation has been extending support annually for about 35-40 activities proposed by FLO. These educational workshops and training programs are mainly for women, and are spread all over India; the three broad categories receiving our assistance are: (1) Grass root level or income generation projects for the unemployed and for the artisans and craftspersons; (2) Middle level or skill development workshops for the educated youth and (3) Senior level or skill enhancement programs for the managerial groups.

From 1996 up to the end of 2007, nearly 15,000 participants from all over India have taken advantage of some 265 training programs/workshops/seminars and symposia, organized by FLO and supported by HSF.

Commomwealth Games 2010: Business Opportunities

In the past, New Delhi has proudly experienced playing host to the Asian Games "ASIAD" in 1951 and 1982. Now, the Commonwealth Games: 2010 to be hosted by the national capital will be the biggest multi-sport event ever organized in India.

With more than ten million foreign visitors coming to India to watch the event, twould not only generate business opportunities but also additional job opportunities in sectors such as hotels, airlines, airports, tour operators, besides eco tourism, crafts and culture.

Since this is one of the most current and sought after subject, FLO and Hanns Seidel Foundation organised a workshop on "Commonwealth Games 2010: Business Opportunities". A similar workshop with special highlight on Travel and Hospitality was organised in collaboration with Air Hostess Academy was held this year too.



Workshop on Tailoring

The first FLO Chennai/HSF Workshop was started on 7th June 2007. It was a ten days tailoring workshop, which concluded on the 17th June 2007 with a valedictory function. The workshop took place in R.C. School, Elapakkam village, which is about 100 km from Chennai. This village being in the interior and with not many opportunities of work close by, other than agriculture that is their main source of livelihood, was the reason we chose it. Through Shivasakthi Trust – a charitable organisation, we were able to recruit forty women for the workshop.



Mr. Ashok Kumar, the master tailor, who runs his tailoring shop in Chennai—Charms School of Design and Tailoring, agreed to conduct the workshop.

Three helper tailors from Embroidery for Life, Chennai – were also recruited and they spent the ten days at the village teaching the women.

Personality Development and Communication Skills

What is personality after all? The outcome of ideas, beliefs and sentiments. Your character is formation of whatever opinion you have about yourself. It is possible that nature has not bestowed you with an impressive personality, but there is no doubt that you can make your personality great by acquiring certain skills.





The art of communication is very important in order to build up a magnetic personality. In order to provide some basic guidelines of Personality Development and Communication Skills,

the Workshop was conducted by FLO with the support of HSF, for the first

time at Shimla. A workshop on the same topic was also held in Lucknow on August 13–14, 2007. A workshop on Enhancing Personality with special reference to Global Class Leadership was also held in New Delhi on December 18–19, 2007.



Techniques of Candle Making

Candle is one form of light, which shall continue to illuminate the environment beautifully without fail. It has undergone many transformations over the years, the warmth and the glow of a candle relax and comforts the mind and its beauty also helps appease the ambiance. With the passage of time this art has entered the commercial market and therefore has become a source of earning.

In order to provide a platform where interested participants and potentials entrepreneurs can learn more about the techniques of candle making and also showcase their talent practically, FLO in collaboration with HSF organize two workshops on the same topic at New Delhi on June 18–19, 2007 and at Aligarh on August 3–4, 2007.





How to Start an Export Business

With the process of globalisation gaining pace in India since the 1990s, Indian economy is on an emerging trend and an export is considered as the key element of growth. India already has a strong base in traditional exports such as textiles, handicrafts, gems and jewellery and the global demand in these sectors is significant. Many potential entrepreneurs are already propelled to enter this arena and go global. Even the B-schools have started specialized courses in this field. But, the right kind of knowledge and guidance forms the basis of every business.

In this background, FLO in collaboration with Hanns Seidel Foundation based in Munich, Germany organised 3 workshops on How to Start an Export Business at Delhi on July 3–4, 2007, at Jaipur on August 24–25, 2007 and at Jodhpur on March 18–19, 2008. This was one of the widely appreciated topics among the participants.





Effective Marketing Strategy

Effective Marketing Strategies is one of the greatest investments that one can make in an enterprise. Success of Effective Marketing Strategy is not driven by what one spend on selling but by how well it is integrated into the very fabric of business offerings.

With the view of the globalised marketing strategy, FLO supported by HSF and in collaboration with NCCI organized a Workshop in Agra. This programme helped participants to build the framework of a complete marketing program that is practical and ready to implement and augment the marketing role within the company and ability to plan and implement practical marketing initiatives to grow business. Similar workshops were also held at Cochin on November 1–2, 2007, at Kolkata on November 23–24, 2007, at Trivandrum on January 24, 2008 and on April 5, 2008.













Developing Global Class Leadership

Business leaders in today's borderless global marketplace face unprecedented challenges. A successful business leader has to be a successful global leader and successful global leaders are those with strategies for guiding and empowering a diversified workforce operating in different countries, cultures, and time zones. opportunity for many such as store manager, buyers, merchandisers, marketing experts, human resources staff, and management coaches among others. It also helped the participants to learn about the varied scopes in the retail business in a short span of time.

Enhancing Personal Effectiveness

It is now conceived that effective interpersonal relations has become the core concern in today's context for the competitive advantage. In order to achieve this, enhancing personal effectiveness is the key element. Successful personal effectiveness relies upon self–esteem and self–management.

A workshop on Enhancing Personal Effectiveness was organised at Guwahati on September 14–15, 2007. This workshop was organized primarily for the benefit of local women and business oriented people. The participants appreciated the workshop and considered it to be very fruitful especially because the knowledge of human relations that they gathered during the workshop can be implemented in their everyday life and more importantly in their work place.



The Business of Fashion in India

Fashion Design is now one of the booming sectors of India in the present times. The Fashion Sector has presently emerged as the most dynamic and fast paced industries of our times with several designers entering the market. India is considered a place for seeking potential original designers, the world now recognizes and the latest research has rated India as an attractive emerging Fashion market.

With an aim to educate and inform participants beyond the knowledge of cutting and design in the world of fashion and to help explore the opportunities available in the said field, FLO in collaboration with HSF and NIFT organised a workshop on The Business of Fashion in India on October 25–26, 2007 at New Delhi.





Emotional Intelligence for Business Excellence

Emotional Intelligence is termed as EQ and in the recent time it is perceived that in a working or business environment EQ is as important as IQ.
